- Methadone as Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) – history, evolution and emergence of basic evidence-based principals.
- How to develop and implement best practices in Methadone Treatment Programs.
- How to develop Methadone Treatment Programming for clients who are involved in the criminal justice system.

Morning session will also include an interactive discussion about implementing of MAT in the Criminal Justice System.



Dr. Ted Parran graduated in 1982 from Case Western Reserve University (CWRU) School of Medicine. He is Board Certified in Internal Medicine and Addiction Medicine and established the first Addiction Fellowship Program at CWRU School of Medicine in 1990. Since 1985, Dr. Parran has worked extensively in the area of addiction medicine. He has supervised addiction consult services, directed acute and sub-acute detoxification units, managed methadone maintenance and buprenorphine opioid treatment programs, and supervised inpatient/residential/PHP/and IOP levels of care. He has consulted with County, State and Federal substance abuse agencies, governments and prosecutors regarding substance use disorders, their impact on Society and their treatment and prevention.
